#### Text A

## **Derek Redmond and the Stunning Olympic Moment**

德里克·雷德蒙德和令人震撼的奥运时刻

Olympians could fill a pool with their tears, on a quadrennial basis. The nature of the competition ensures that however many dreams of glory, most will only experience disappointment. (1) At that moment, the bitter taste not just of a single defeat but of four

years of wasted effort can simply be too much for some to handle. More than that, quite a few athletes can't even win without tears. But no Olympic emotional outburst is ever likely to dislodge Derek Redmond's in the minds not just of Britons but of anyone old enough to remember the 1992 Games. (2) What made this moment special was that it brought into focus not just the near-heroic **desperation** of a single professional athlete but a much more universal theme: the nature of parenthood.

- He never had a chance. Redmond travelled to two Olympics and both ended with injury-induced heartache. For all his ability as an athlete — and he was considered likely to win a medal in Barcelona — he will forever be remembered for tearfully completing his 400m semi-final using his father as a **crutch**. His body never gave him the opportunity to **redefine** the way the world perceived him: two years after the Barcelona Games, following an 11th operation on his achilles tendon, his athletics career was over. This was his last race of any significance.
- His body had given him some hope: in the first round Redmond had run his quickest 400m for four years. "I was feeling absolutely 100% before the race," he told me in 2006.
- "On the day everything went smooth. I got a really good start, which was unusual for me. 4 I think I was the first to react to the **pistol**. But about three **stride**s later I felt a **pop**."
- It was his hamstring. Redmond collapsed to the floor, clutching his leg. Most athletes would have been quietly carried off the track and towards medical attention, but as the Red Cross workers approached Redmond insisted going on, saying to himself, "There's no way I'm going to be **stretcher**ed out of these Olympics. I didn't know where I was, I really, really believed I could still qualify."
- **Bizarrely**, the reason Redmond first started **limp**ing around the track was a belief that if he limped fast enough he might still overtake four people and qualify for the final. "Believe me, at the time I thought I was running," he said later. "It's only when I see the playback I realise I wasn't actually running very quick at all."



- Meanwhile, Redmond's father Jim was fighting his way on to the track. "When I saw Derek hit the deck, I thought it was my mind playing tricks on me," The next thing he knew, he was on the track. Jim told his son to stop, in case the injury might heal in time for him to compete in the relay. Derek refused. "Well then," Jim said, "we're going to finish this together." And finish it they did, slowly, and with the younger man's **anguish** becoming visibly greater with every pace.
- Back in Northampton Redmond's mother, Jennie, was watching events unfold on television, weeping. She later told the press that the last time she had seen her son so unhappy



was when he didn't get the bike he wanted for his sixth birthday. Redmond's 28-year-old sister Karen was nine months **pregnant**; as she watched her brother's world collapse she started to feel **contractions**.

- Back in Barcelona, father and son **batted away** a **succession** of officials who tried and failed to **convince** them to **clear** the track. "Even now, it's hard to say how or why I did it," said Jim. "It was a **spontaneous** reaction, as if I had seen him hit by a car. I certainly didn't run down to help him finish if anything it was to stop him. (3) I could accept the fact that my son was injured, but not that he was going to **carry on** in pain, causing him even greater damage."
- "After I crossed the line I was taken to the doctors and I was crying like a baby the whole time," Redmond told me. "I had no idea how the crowd had reacted until I saw the video they were the last thing on my mind. It could have gone one of two ways: they'd either think 'what a complete **prat**' or 'good on him'. Luckily they chose the second one."
- Most observers, though, were truly moved by what they witnessed. On his way from the stadium Redmond met Linford Christie, Britain's team captain. (4) The pair were far from friendly, and their enmity had become public after Christie criticised the 4×400m relay team that won gold at the 1991 World Championships in Tokyo. But that day, Christie approached his team-mate and the pair wordlessly embraced. "Tears started and we both broke down," said Redmond. "I've changed my views of him completely. It shows that this sport isn't just about coming here and making money."
- Perhaps not, but as it happens Redmond's courage that day allowed him to enjoy a second career as a **motivational** speaker. That wasn't the only lasting effect of those injury-**plagued** years, however: in Barcelona the swimmer Sharron Davies, another British athlete who had
  - endured a disappointing Games, **sought out** Redmond to express her **sympathy**. The pair married two years later (but divorced in 2000). More long-lasting are the **chronic** stomach **ulcer**s caused by Redmond's use of **painkilling** medication.
- (5) "Long after the names of the **medallists** have **fade**d from our minds, you will be remembered for having finished, for having tried so hard, for having a father to demonstrate the strength of his love for his son. I thank you, and I will always
  - remember your race and I will always remember you the purest, most courageous example of **grit** and determination I have seen."
- It is as true today as it was 19 years ago.

#### From Sports Stars to Best Cultural Ambassadors

## 从体坛明星到优秀文化大使

- 1 China's French Open tennis champion Li Na is writing a memoir to tell the story of, as the book's title claims, *How to Go West and Win*.
- (1) Penguin will co-publish the book in Chinese in spring 2012 with a Chinese partner—the first for the British company whose business in China up to now has focused on importing English titles and exporting translations. However, it is not the first time for foreign publishers

to take interest in a Chinese sports star. Seven years ago, Chinese basketball player Yao Ming's **biography** *A life in two worlds* was published in the United States by Miramax.

Just like Yao and Li, a new generation of Chinese sports elite are now helping to raise the country's **profile** in the world. As sports is a universal language, the Chinese sports stars are the best cultural ambassadors to help the world know more about China.



- Yao is definitely a pioneer for helping China open up. (2)

  The 2.26 meter giant, with the **combination** of strength, height, skills, as well as his global **celebrity**, is the perfect sport **icon** to represent the growth and global status of an emerging China, while his humor, modesty and **tolerance** shown in the game, has impressed the world and helped **resolve** misunderstandings across different cultures.
- The Shanghai native, labeled as China's biggest export to the United States, played for eight seasons in the NBA after being the **top overall pick** in the 2002 **draft**, and **announced** his retirement in July.

- 6 He averaged 19 points and 9.2 **rebounds** and has been named in the NBA All-Star team eight times. Yao made the cover story of the Asian Edition of *Time Magazine* twice, and was selected by the magazine as one of its "100 most **influential** people in the world today" twice. Three-time All-Star and former Houston Rockets guard Steve Francis has called Yao a "pioneer" in bridging the U.S. and Chinese basketball cultures.
- "Yao was the first Chinese basketball player to break the **barrier** to come to the U.S. to play basketball and won respect, and Yao's case enabled other Chinese players to **follow suit**," said Francis.
- "Yao has been a transformational player and a testament to the globalization of our game."
- "His dominant play and endearing demeanor along with his extensive humanitarian efforts have made him an international fan favorite and provided an extraordinary bridge between basketball fans in the United States and China."
- Yao's influence went far beyond sports. The video in which he taught Rockets teammate Tracy Mcgrady how to handle **chopsticks** was widely watched on the Internet. And his Yao Restaurant is also famous in the U.S. Yao also earned a great deal of praise for his humorous and **intelligent** remarks. In an interview with ESPN, Yao stated that the national anthem of the United States is his favorite song, "for I have to listen to it at least 82 times every year." When **queried** about his English skill, Yao simply responded "I have learned how to say 'next question'."
- The famous "Yao quotes" had been used by U.S. President Barack Obama.
- "Of course as a new president and also as a basketball fan, I have learned from the words of Yao Ming who said, 'No matter whether you are new, or an old team member, you need time to **adjust to** one another,' "Obama said in a 2009 Washington meeting. "Through the **constructive** meetings that we have already had, and through this dialogue, I am **confident** that we will meet Yao's standard."
- Yao's cultural influence continued after his retirement. Everything he does still attracts worldwide attention. Yao returned to school this week to study for a university degree in Shanghai's **prestigious** Jiaotong University. (3) He is **balancing** his class work with running a

<u>Chinese basketball team — the Shanghai Sharks — and a jam-packed schedule of public appearances.</u>

Tennis player Li Na, who also speaks fluent English, is considered to be a successor to Yao as a cultural ambassador since she won the French Open this June. Li won China's first **WTA** singles title in 2004, became the country's first





**Grand Slam quarterfinalist** in 2006 and China's first world top 10 players this year after reaching the Australian Open final. The French Open victory lifted her to world number four, equalling Japanese Kimiko Date-Krumm's Asian record.

- Li, from the central Chinese city of Wuhan, is quite popular worldwide. Her age, which is not young, her experience of coming back from retirement and her **personality** all **arouse** curiosity in the West. She is different from most Chinese sportswomen who are known in the West as **straight-faced**, **obedient** and careful about what they say.
- The 29-year-old Li is confident, sociable and relaxed when facing camera and media, and like Yao Ming, she has a sense of humor. She is fond of **poking fun at** her husband, who is also her personal trainer, during her interviews. Once she said: "My husband promised to **let me loose with** his credit cards if I win (the championship)." She even complained to reporters about his snoring before major matches and asked the chair umpire to tell excited Chinese fans in the stands to keep quiet. (4) Her brand of humor represents a new image for Chinese athletes, and quite possibly for the country **at large**. She is also **acclaimed** by some as "China's best **PR rep**."
- "Li has a very straight-talking unusual personality and is more outgoing than most Chinese athletes and we think this could **translate** around the world," said Penguin China managing director Jo Lusby.
- (5) "She is a great ambassador, a great athlete, a great personality, already a national hero in China and the western world is beginning to get to know her and enjoying her as she has great talent on the court and is good fun off the court," WTA tour chief executive Stacey Allaster said.
- With their fluent English, **glamorous** personalities and convincing results, the Chinese sports stars have become new idols for a new generation. What they have changed is not only the image of Chinese sports, but also the image of the whole country.
