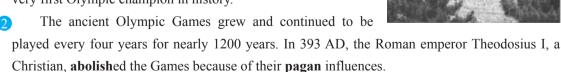

Text A

The Brief History of Olympic Games

奥运会简史

- 1 According to **legend**, the ancient Olympic Games were founded by Heracles (the Roman Hercules), a son of Zeus. Yet the first Olympic Games for which we still have written records
 - were held in 776 BC, though it is generally believed that the Games had been going on for many years already. At this Olympic Games, a **naked** runner, Coroebus, a cook from Elis, won the **sole** event at the Olympics, the **stade** a run of approximately 192 meters (210 yards). This made Coroebus the very first Olympic champion in history.



Approximately 1500 years later, a young Frenchman named Pierre de Coubertin began their revival. Coubertin is now known as le Rénovateur. Coubertin was a French aristocrat born on January 1, 1863. He was only seven years old when France was overrun by the Germans during the Franco-Prussian War of 1870. Some believe that Coubertin attributed the defeat of France not to its military skills but rather to the French soldiers' lack of vigor. After examining the



education of the German, British, and American children, Coubertin decided that it was exercise, more specifically, sports, that made a **well-rounded** and vigorous person.

4 Coubertin's **attempt** to get France interested in sports was not met with **enthusiasm**. Still,

Coubertin **persist**ed. In 1890, he organized and founded a sports organization, Union des Sociétés Francaises de Sports Athlétiques (USFSA). Two years later, Coubertin first **pitch**ed **his idea to** revive the Olympic Games. At a meeting of the Union des Sports Athlétiques in Paris on November 25, 1892, Coubertin made a famous speech, yet it did not inspire action. Though Coubertin was



not the first to **propose** the revival of the Olympic Games, he was certainly the most **well-connected** and persistent of those to do so. Two years later, Coubertin organized a meeting with 79 **delegates** who represented nine countries. He gathered these delegates in an **auditorium** that was **decorated** by **neoclassical murals** and similar additional points of ambiance. At this meeting, Coubertin **eloquently** spoke of the revival of the Olympic Games. This time, Coubertin aroused interest.

The delegates at the conference voted unanimously for the Olympic Games. The delegates also decided to have Coubertin construct an international committee to organize the Games. This committee became the International Olympic Committee (IOC; Comité Internationale Olympique) and Demetrious Vikelas from Greece was selected to be its first president. Athens was chosen as the location for the revival of the Olympic Games and the planning was begun.

Text B

The Official Mascots of the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games 2008 北京奥运会官方吉祥物

- 1 A set of five doll **mascots** Fuwa, for the 2008 Olympic Games were **unveil**ed in Beijing on November 11, exactly 1,000 days before the event's opening ceremony. The **long-anticipated** mascots, which **embody** the natural characteristics of four of China's popular animals the Fish, the Panda, the Tibetan **Antelope**, the **Swallow** and the Olympic Flame, were presented at a grand ceremony inside the Workers' Gymnasium in Beijing.
- (1) Like the Five Olympic Rings from which they draw their color and **inspiration**, the five Fuwa will serve as the Official Mascots of Beijing 2008 Olympic Games, carrying a message of friendship, peace and blessings from China to children all over the world.

- 3 Designed to express the playful qualities of five little children who form an **intimate** circle of friends, the five Fuwa also embody the natural characteristics of four of China's most popular animals: the Fish, the Panda, the Tibetan Antelope, the Swallow, and the Olympic Flame.
- In China's traditional culture and art, the fish and water designs are **symbols** of **prosperity** and harvest. And so Beibei carries the blessing of prosperity. A fish is also a symbol of **surplus** in Chinese culture, another measure of a good year and a good life. The **ornamental** lines of the water-wave designs are taken from well-known Chinese paintings of the past. Among the five Fuwa, Beibei is known to be gentle and pure. Strong in water sports, she **reflects** the blue Olympic ring.



- (2) Each of the Fuwa has a rhyming two-syllable name, a traditional way of expressing affection for children in China. Beibei is the Fish, Jingjing is the Panda, Huanhuan is the Olympic Flame, Yingying is the Tibetan Antelope and Nini is the Swallow. When you put their names together Bei Jing Huan Ying Ni they say "Welcome to Beijing", offering a warm invitation that reflects the mission of the five Fuwa as young ambassadors for the Olympic Games.
- The five Fuwa also embody both the landscape and the dreams and **aspirations** of people from every part of the vast country of China. In their origins and their **headpieces**, you can see the five elements of nature the sea, forest, fire, earth and sky all **stylistic rendered** in ways that represent the deep traditional influences of Chinese folk art and ornamentation.
- In the ancient culture of China, there is a grand tradition of spreading **blessings** through signs and symbols. Each of the five Fuwa **symbolizes** a different blessing and will honor this tradition by carrying their blessings to the children of the world. (3) Prosperity, happiness, passion, health and good luck will be spread to every continent as the five Fuwa carry their invitation to Beijing 2008 to every part of the globe.
- At the heart of their mission, and through all of their work, the five Fuwa will seek to unite the world in peace and friendship through the Olympic spirit. **Dedicated** to helping Beijing 2008 spread its **theme** of One World, One Dream to every continent, the five Fuwa reflect the deep desire of the Chinese people to reach out to the world in friendship through the Games, and to invite every man, woman and child to take part in the great celebration of human **solidarity** that China will host in the light of the flame in 2008.
- 9 Jingjing makes children smile and that's why he brings the blessing of happiness wherever he goes. You can see his joy in the charming naivety of his dancing pose and the lovely wave of his black and white fur. As a national treasure and a protected species, pandas are



adored by people everywhere. (4) The lotus designs in Jingjing's headdress, which are inspired by the porcelain paintings of the Song Dynasty (A.D.960 — 1234), symbolize the lush forest and the harmonious relationship between man and nature. Jingjing was chosen to represent our desire to protect nature's gifts, and to preserve the beauty of nature for all generations. Jingjing is charmingly naive and optimistic. He is an athlete noted for strength

who represents the black Olympic ring.

10 In the intimate circle of Fuwa, Huanhuan is the big brother. He is a child of fire,

symbolizing the Olympic Flame and the **passion** of sport, and passion is the blessing he **bestows**. Huanhuan stands in the center of Fuwa as the core **embodiment** of the Olympic spirit. And while he inspires all with the passion to run faster, jump higher and be stronger, he is also open and inviting. Wherever the light of Huanhuan shines, the inviting warmth of Beijing 2008 and the wishful blessings of the Chinese people can be felt. The **fiery** designs of his head ornament are drawn from the famed Dunhuang



murals, with just a touch of China's traditional lucky designs. Huanhuan is outgoing and enthusiastic. He **excel**s at all the ball games and represents the red Olympic ring.

Like all antelopes, Yingying is fast and agile and can swiftly cover great stretches of land



as he races across the earth. (5) A symbol of the vastness of China's landscape, the antelope carries the blessing of health, the strength of body that comes from **harmony** with nature. Yingying's flying pose **captures** the **essence** of a **species** unique to the Qinghai-Tibet Plateau, one of the first animals put under protection in China. The selection of the Tibetan Antelope reflects Beijing **commitment** to a Green Olympics. His head ornament **incorporates** several **decorative** styles from the Qinghai-Tibet and Sinkiang cultures and

the **ethnic** design traditions of Western China. Strong in **track and field** events, Yingying is a quick-witted and agile boy who represents the yellow Olympic ring.

Every spring and summer, the children of Beijing have flown beautiful kites on the **currents** of wind that blow through the capital. Among the kite designs, the golden-winged swallow is traditionally one of the most popular. Nini's figure is drawn from this grand tradition of flying designs. Her golden wings symbolize





the **infinite** sky and spread good-luck as a blessing wherever she flies. Swallow is also pronounced "yan" in Chinese, and Yanjing is what Beijing was called as an ancient capital city. Among the five Fuwa, Nini is as **innocent** and joyful as a swallow. She is strong in gymnastics and represents the green Olympic ring.

Subject and Verb Agreement

主谓一致

英语句中的主语有单复数及人称的变化,其谓语动词需要根据主语的人称及数的不同 而有所不同,即谓语的动词与其主语在人称和数上必须保持一致。

以下情况谓语用单数形式

- 1. 主语虽然有"and"连接,但主语受到 "each", "every", 或"no"修饰时; 例如: Each building and each room was cleaned completely yesterday.
- 2. 如果主语为单数,尽管主语后面有如下 11 个修饰语之一时: with, along with, together with, as well as, like, rather than, but, except, besides, including, in addition to; 例如: Nobody but Jane's parents knows the secret.
- 3. 当非谓语动词及从句充当主语时;
 - 例如: When and where to build the gas station has not been decided so far.
 - 注意: 当 "what"引导主语从句或者由 "and" 连接两个动词不定式或动词 V-ing 充当主语时,谓语动词单复数要根据意义一致原则来确定。
 - 例如: What we need here are workers.
 - What we need is money.
 - Lying and stealing are immoral.
- 4. 由 "each"和"some", "any", "no" + body/one/thing 构成的复合不定代词及 "the other"



充当主语时;

例如: Someone over the phone wants to speak to you.

5. "many a或 more than one" + 单数名词充当主语时;

例如: Many a student has been to Beijing before.

There is more than one answer to your question.

6. "one and a half + 复数名词" 充当主语时(注意与第二条中的第5点区别);

例如: One and a half hours is enough to visit the city.

7. "one of + 复数+定语从句" 前有 the, the only one, the very 等修饰语时;

例如: Tom is one of the boys who are always ready to help others.

8. 形式上是复数但意义是单数的名词充当主语时;

例如: The Arabian Nights is read all over the world.

9. 某些特殊的以s结尾的名词,或表示学科的名词充当主语时(注意与第二条中的第4点区别);

例如: Every possible means <u>has been used</u> to prevent the air pollution, but the sky is still not clear.

10. 成对的名词(如knife and fork, butter and bread, truth and honesty)充当主语时; 例如: Knife and fork is required in a western style restaurant.

11. 表示时间、距离、金钱、重量、度量、容量、温度等的复数名词充当主语时;例如: Thirty miles is considered a long distance.

12. "the number of + 复数名词"充当主语,表示"…的数目、数量"时(注意与第二条中的第8点区别);

例如: The number of people invited <u>was</u> forty, yet a number of them <u>were</u> absent due to different reasons.

二 以下情况谓语用复数形式

1. 由 "and" 连接两个并列主语时;

例如: My grandfather and my father like to drink tea rather than coffee.

2. 由两个部分组成的物体名词充当主语时;

例如: His trousers are made of cotton.

3. 表示山脉、群岛、瀑布等的专有名词和以复数形式出现的表示同姓的一家人或同名、同姓的若干人时;

例如: The Alps are one of the great mountain range systems of Europe.

The Jones have been invited to the party.

4. 以 s 结尾的表示学科的名词在表示有关方面的见解、原理、活动、情况时;例如: What are his politics?

5. 由"one or two + 复数名词" 充当主语时;

例如: One or two days are enough to visit the city.

I. Structure of a Letter 书信的结构

A letter has the following six parts:

1. The Heading (信头)

This includes the address, line by line, with the last line being the date. Skip a line after the heading. If using preaddressed stationery, just add the date.

2. The Greeting (称呼)

The greeting always ends with a comma. The greeting may be formal, beginning with the word "dear" and using the person's given name or relationship, or it may be informal if appropriate.

正式体: Dear Uncle Jim, Dear Mr. Wilkins,

非正式体:Hi Joe,

Occasionally very personal greetings may end with an exclamation point for emphasis.

3. The Body (正文)

It's also known as the main text. This includes the message you want to write.
